

GAUDETE SUNDAY

There is an element of spring-cleaning to Advent. Although not quite as penitential as Lent, it is nevertheless a time for taking stock, for preparing a way, for smoothing out the path of our life to let the Lord enter.

Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, publicly marks one of the underlying themes of this season: joy! Coming from the Latin word meaning "rejoice!", Gaudete is the watermark of today's liturgy. Joy jumps out at us from today's prayers, readings, psalms, and no doubt from our songs and hymns.

Why be joyful? The sole reason is that the Christ, whose advent we await, is coming not to condemn or call us to task, but to set us free. The Jews longed for the coming of the Messiah; we are encouraged to yearn with a joyful expectation for the coming of Jesus. Jesus is coming not to judge but to save. This caused the psalmist to sing with joy: "God is my salvation, I trust - I shall not fear." Paul shares in this exuberant joy at the nearness of God and he writes to the Philippians with a recipe for happiness. Indeed, he says that happiness is exactly what he wishes for the Christian community.

CHRISTMAS ENVELOPES

The Christmas Envelopes are used for the collection at Masses for Christmas Day, which is the traditional 'Thank You' collection by parishioners to the priests of their parish for their work and service. Priests here receive no salary whatsoever for their work and depend on the generosity of parishioners for sustenance. The money in the Christmas Envelopes and the collection on Christmas Day will be shared equally by the clergy. Please note that those of you in the parish GIFT AID SCHEME should use your Gift Aid envelopes for the Christmas Collection and hand this in. The priests will get your offering and the Parish will benefit from the tax refund on your offering.

During the Advent Season we will not be displaying any flowers in the church in accordance with the church norm. If you would like to make a donation to decorate the church for Christmas, it will be greatly appreciated.

FILIPINOS NINE DAY MASSES (NOVENA)

Catholics in the Philippines have celebrated their own pre-Christmas novena for 600 years. Simbang Gabi (Tagalog for "Night Mass") is a series of nine Masses traditionally celebrated in the pre-dawn hours each day from December 16 to December 24. It is a series of nine dawn masses on the days leading up to Christmas. It begins on December 16 and ends at midnight on the 24th of December, when a midnight mass is held. This tradition was introduced by the Spanish friars to allow the farmers to hear mass before going to the fields early in the morning. The masses can start as early as 4 in the morning. Simbang Gabi is also known by its popular Spanish name, Misa de Gallo, or "Mass of the Rooster."

Here at St Peter's Church, we will introduce the nine day masses but it will begin on Friday 15th December -Saturday 23rd December from 7:00pm - 8:00pm. Please let your family and friends come to this special mass before Christmas. Simbang Gabi is not just a tradition that is celebrated because it is necessary; it is the spiritual preparation for Christmas and commemorates the birth of Jesus Christ. The celebration is also seen as a way of requesting blessings from the Lord.

THE 12 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

Here is an interesting explanation of that well loved Christmas carol "The 12 days of Christmas". From 1558 to 1829 Roman Catholics in this country were not allowed to practice their faith openly. During this time someone wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics!

The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ

2 Turtledoves were the Old and New Testament

3 French Hens stood for faith, hope and love.

The 4 calling birds were the 4 gospels Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

The 5 golden rings recalled the Torah – the first 5 Books of the Old Testament.

The 6 geese-a-laying stood for the 6 days of creation.

The 7 swans-a-swimming represented the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The 10 Lords-a-leaping were the 10 Commandments. The 11 pipers piping stood for the 11 faithful disciples.

The 12 drummers drumming symbolised the 12 points of belief in the Apostles Creed.

Now when you hear this carol this Christmas you will think of it in a different light.
